ATTENTION ALL STALLINGBOROUGH FOOTPATH USERS



Looking back from Little London towards Stallingborough

Some of the Stallingborough Parish Councillors have endorsed a proposal to improve the footpath from the end of the track from the church field to the Little London pub and Farm Shop.

The pictures above are a rough depiction of the proposed improvement. This scheme would also provide the residents of Keelby Road pedestrian access to the heart of Stallingborough village.

The beauty of the scheme is, that all that is required is to merely expose the overgrown surface of the old B1210 road that was re-routed some fifty years ago.

Any work done would cause minimal traffic disruption.

In addition, a 30 mph speed limit between the railway crossing and the Stallingborough roundabout would be imposed.(A recent survey counted 45 commercial vehicles, HGVs and Transit size vans, in a half hour period on this section of road). Funding for speed control signage is already available.

Membership Committee



CHURCH NEWS –

ST PETER AND ST PAUL, STALLINGBOROUGH

New Year good wishes to all Stallingborough residents from your Parish Church!

December was a busy month with three Christmas Services and the church was decorated up including a large, beautiful Christmas tree very kindly donated by the Hoyes family and decorated by two of our PCC members.

We had the annual, specially dedicated Christmas service, for the “Home From Home” Care Home Group, some of whose residents live at the Old Vicarage next to the Church. Other residents came to the event from Group homes elsewhere in Lincolnshire. These services are video'd professionally and appear on YouTube. Also we had all the children and staff from the village C of E school running their lovely Christingle Service and then we had a Carol and Crib service for everyone on Sunday 21st December afternoon and it was so lovely to see the church very well attended again with families bringing their children and grandchildren. Lay preacher Kevin Onn from Healing very ably led both the Care Home Service and the Carol Service for us and Carolyn Pearson from the village played the organ. Thank you to everyone who helped and came to our services and supported our traditional English village church! It would be lovely to see you all again. There is a normal Sunday service planned for 9am on 22nd March at the time of writing.

The school had to postpone their first attempt at getting to the church for the Christingle because of the severe weather. Also access to the church continues to be difficult in inclement weather, including for wheelchair user residents, by the poor state of the last highway section of Church Lane. In 2024 after investigations with the Land Registry and the Highways Authority plus copious!! correspondence, PCC members had a formal site meeting with NELC about it, (it is adopted highway and has always been so). In the '70s it was a proper, “normal” businesslike

What to do and how to prepare for an emergency

How to be better prepared

During emergencies, always follow the advice of the emergency services.

There are however things you can do now to make you more prepared should you be caught up in an emergency.

5 minutes preparing now could save you a lot of time in an emergency...Know what the biggest risks are to you and your area – you are already reading this so you are well on your way to understanding what the risks are to the county. Find more on the main risks that we face and prepare for here(list not exclusive):

road with flat grass verges either side for refuge against oncoming vehicles and a proper footpath along the Vicarage wall side. Highways did provide some long overdue highway signage and some improvement in drainage just around the corner and agree it's certainly got problems. However, the area still remains prone to flooding and is a totally overgrown, pothole ridden mess, especially in Winter.

There are still some repairs needed on the church driven by our Quintennial Inspection so we are investigating more roof work over the nave and the big broken weathervane looks like the leaning tower of Pisa on top of the tower roof which is a rather bad advert for our "kerb appeal" as an estate agent might say.

As for our eventual provision of facilities, (accessible toilet/tea/coffee etc.), based on lots of work done so far including provisional internal plans/Anglian Water survey/liaising with C of E architects et al, we could ideally do with somebody knowledgeable and with some time to help take that forward. Funding grants must also be sought. If anybody is interested in helping to take this project forward to help make the church more of a community building, like other village churches have done, please get in touch for an informal chat.
