Cllr. Gilbert was elected as Chairman and Cllr. Hoyes as Vice-Chair for the year.

Various planning applications were discussed and all planning applications discussed at the PC meetings are available to view on the NELC website at www.nelincs.gov.uk. You just go to the Planning Applications, agree the terms and conditions and then you can input the planning application reference number or the address and it will bring up the documents for you to view.

During May the playground had its annual inspection and any points raised have already been actioned.

The internal audit has also now been carried out and the next stage is to submit all documentation as required for external audit. This will take place during June and July. The public are entitled to inspect the accounts by appointment and all details are on our website.

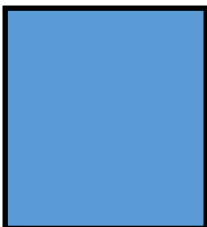



Consultation closed for Cadent's H₂East Pipeline: Humber to Nottinghamshire

Cadent has been consulting on its proposals to construct, operate and maintain an underground hydrogen pipeline from the Humber, through Lincolnshire into Nottinghamshire. The consultation, which ran until 14th May 2026, is now closed. To everyone who has taken the time to provide feedback we would like to say thank you.

The H₂East Pipeline is part of East Coast Hydrogen, a collaboration between Cadent, National Gas and Northern Gas Networks to connect planned hydrogen production and storage with industrial users.

The hydrogen pipeline will enable manufacturers of steel, chemicals, bricks and food to switch from natural gas to low-carbon hydrogen. It will play a vital role in safeguarding British manufacturing, encouraging inward investment, decarbonising energy intensive industry and supporting the development of new skills and jobs in the region.

At the consultation, plans for the underground hydrogen pipeline and Hydrogen Above Ground Infrastructure (HAGI) search areas were presented. The pipeline will be underground and around 150km (93 miles) in length with HAGIs at certain points along the route to help check and monitor the pipeline.

During consultation, Cadent held ten in-person events and one public online webinar, with 399 people attending in total. Cadent would like to thank everyone who came along to the events to meet the team and those who have left their feedback.

Over the coming months, feedback received will be considered and used to help develop plans for the pipeline. A second consultation will be held to share our updated proposals, including any changes to the pipeline's route and HAGI locations.

It is the intention to apply for a Development Consent Order (DCO) in 2028, which would be granted by the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero.
